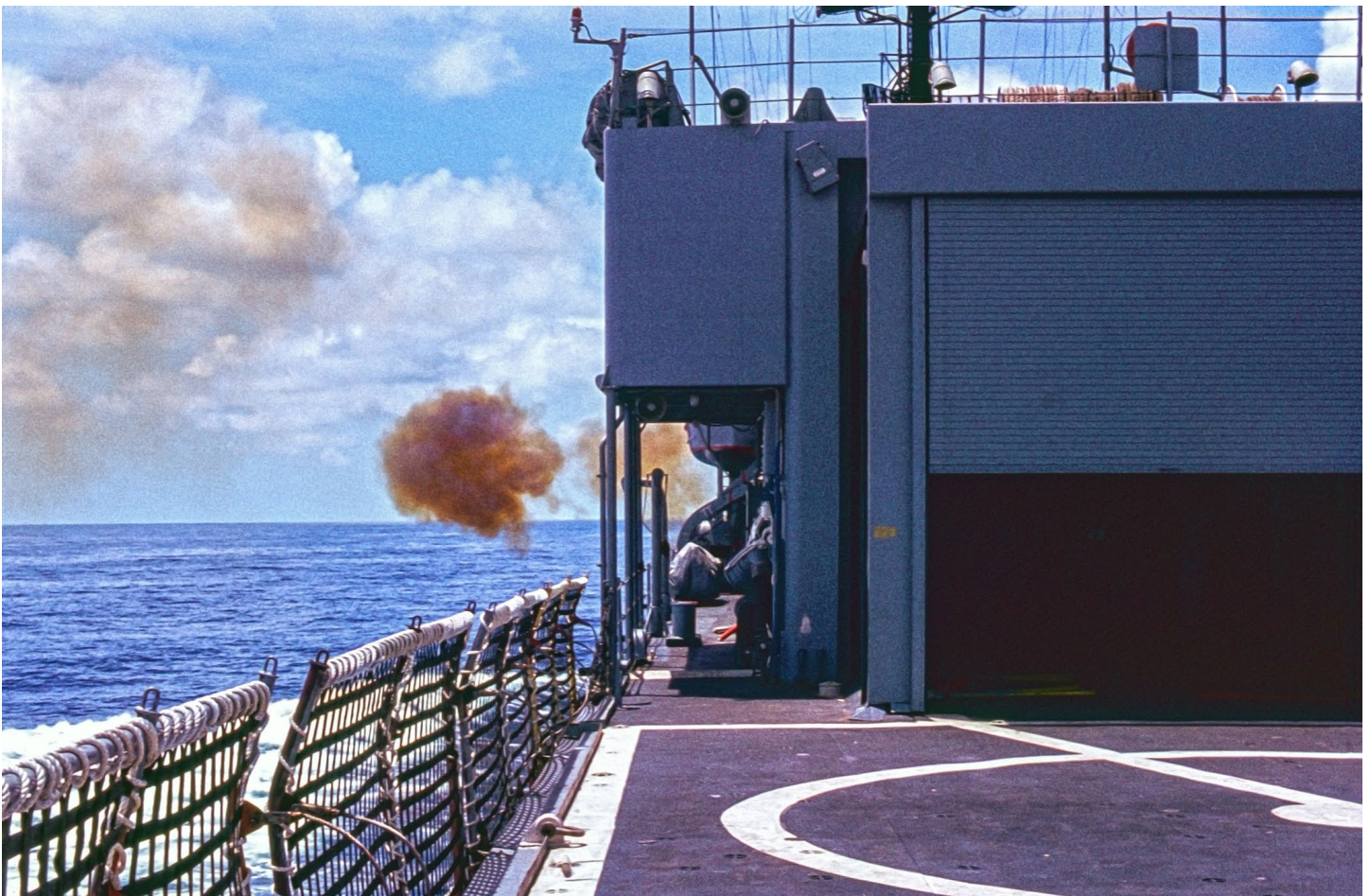

## Jacksonville, FL / April 22-25, 2022

### ***Welcome to Jacksonville!***

Come to Jacksonville, known as Florida's "First Coast", for the 2022 USS Bradley Reunion. Among the events being planned are visits to historic St. Augustine, and a river cruise and excursion to Amelia Island. Do not miss this opportunity to catch up with your friends and share some sea stories.



### ***Hotel Information***

The reunion officially begins on Friday, April 22 and ends on Monday, April 25. You will be staying at the full-service **DoubleTree by Hilton Jacksonville – Riverfront**, located at 1201 Riverplace Blvd., Jacksonville, FL 32207. The Doubletree is centrally located on the downtown riverfront and set amidst the historic San Marco district, and across from The Jacksonville Landing. While staying at the hotel you may consider taking the water taxi, from the hotel, across the river to *Jacksonville Landing*. Located along the north bank of the *St. John's River*, *Jacksonville Landing* offers several restaurants, an extensive food court, and unique shops.



The room rate is **\$135 (Standard)**, **\$145 (Riverfront View)** or **\$165 (Riverfront Jr. Suite)** plus tax per night, based on room type occupancy and **includes breakfast**. All guest rooms are non-smoking. For those of you who choose to arrive early or stay late, the same room rate is available three days before and three days after the official reunion dates, based on availability.

Be aware that there have been a lot of problems with calling hotel central reservations offices. The safest, most fool-proof way to make your hotel reservations is on-line through the hotel "booking link". If you are comfortable with using a computer, we highly suggest you make your hotel reservations using the Hotel Booking Link. [Click here to make your hotel reservations on-line now.](#)

If you have any difficulty getting a reservation at the group rate, or plan on coming in early or staying late at the same rate, you should call Military Reunion Planners at 817-251-3551 or email us at [info@MilitaryReunionPlanners.com](mailto:info@MilitaryReunionPlanners.com). We may be able to help with your reservation.

The hotel is holding rooms until they sell out or **March 22, 2022**, whichever comes first.

### ***Transportation & Directions***

The closest airport is Jacksonville International (JAX); the hotel is located about 15 miles from the airport. The least expensive way to the hotel would be via Uber or Lyft. You may also take the Super Shuttle for about \$25 pp. The Super Shuttle kiosk is located in Baggage Claim. Reservations are required for your return trip from the hotel back to the airport. Super Shuttle can be reached at 904-765-9999. For those of you driving to the reunion, the hotel is offering complimentary self-parking. Valet parking is also available for a fee.

## JACKSONVILLE, FL / APRIL 22-25, 2022

**Meet & Greet:** Friday, April 22 (6:00pm)

Join everyone and kick-off this year's reunion with a Welcome Reception at the hotel.

**Historic St. Augustine Excursion:** Saturday, April 23 (9:00am-4:00pm)

Regarded as the oldest city in the United States, together we'll explore the incredible history of St. Augustine and Florida and discover how it grew and prospered under Spanish, British, French and



American rule. Your professional guide will regale you with captivating historical accounts of the native Indians, Spanish Galleons, Pirates and the Revolutionary War. You will ride through the *Fountain of Youth* property and hear the fable of the fountain, Ponce de Leon's discovery of *La Florida*, and his encounter with the natives. We tour all the major sites and stop at the Castillo de San Marcos, the fort that was never captured in

battle. St. Augustine was also the first winter resort for the rich and famous during the Gilded Age. After the excursion, there will be time for self-exploration, shopping, and lunch, on your own, in this quaint little town. This will be a wonderful day in *Old Florida*.

**River Cruise and Amelia Island Excursion:** Sunday, April 24 (8:30am – 3:30pm)

Amelia Island is known as "Florida's Golden Isle." One of a chain of barrier islands, *Amelia Island* is a charming place - 13 miles long and two miles wide. Settled by the French, developed by the Spanish, named by the English and tamed by the Americans, *Amelia* is the only location in the United States to have been under eight different flags. But first, enjoy a River Cruise to intriguing Cumberland Island. This excursion offers an extensive and rich history of Amelia and Cumberland Island with views of wildlife along the way. We cruise by Fernandina's shrimp boats, historic Old Towne and Ft. Clinch to the wild horses of Cumberland Island. Our historians will share the colorful stories that define the character of this unique part of the world. After the cruise you will be escorted by our local guide to an area where you may have lunch on your own. Take time for a leisurely lunch by the water and/or browse the many interesting shops. Then, we will have a guided, riding tour for an inside look at the Island's most historical attractions including the "Silk Stocking District," boasting some of Florida's most elegant Victorian homes, *Fort Clinch*, and *American Beach*, the only beach open to African Americans until the 1960's. We will take the scenic route back to the hotel and make a short stop at Kingsley Plantation where you will learn of the unique history of a black African slave who married her



white Master and helped him run his cotton plantation, which is now a state park. This is fantastic day discovering *Old Florida* and a bygone era. Don't miss it!

### **Farewell Banquet Dinner: Sunday, April 24 (6:00pm)**

Join your friends for the Banquet Dinner at the Hotel (Duval Ballroom). Cocktails will be available from the cash bar at 1800; dinner will be served at 1900. Please make your entrée selection on the reservation form.

### **Cancellation Insurance**

- Tour times are always subject to change up until tour time. A final itinerary is available at check-in.

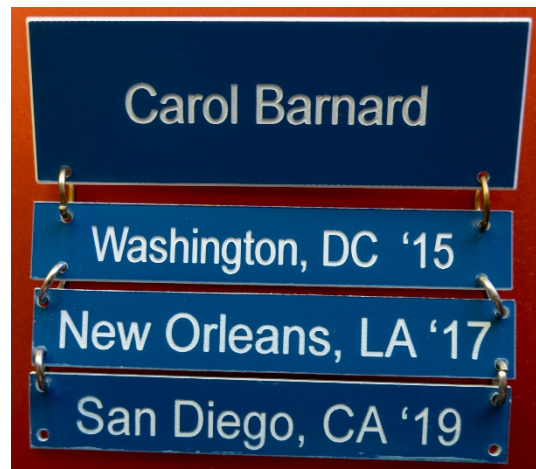

There is a \$15pp surcharge for orders taken over the phone. Please make a copy of your order prior to mailing. Note tour times are subject to change. Requests for refunds must be made in writing and postmarked no later than the reservation due date. No refunds will be made after this date unless you have purchased Tour Cancellation Insurance. Cancellation Insurance expires at 11:59 pm the day before the reunion start date. Please note there is a refund processing fee of \$10 per person plus 3.5% fee charged by credit card processing company. Your cancelled check is your receipt as well as proof of purchase. For written confirmation of your reservation please send a self-addressed, stamped envelope with your cancellation request. A \$25 return check fee applies. MRP will not be held liable for failure of vendors to provide contracted services or any injuries/accidents that may occur during the reunion.

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## **Name Tags**

The other thing that's different this year is how we are ordering our name tags. On the Reservation Form above you're asked how you want your name to appear on your "hotel" badge. This is a *paper badge* you will use in the morning to get your breakfast.

At previous reunions our blue name tags have looked like this for shipmates and their wives or guests:



This year we need to order these through a separate process.

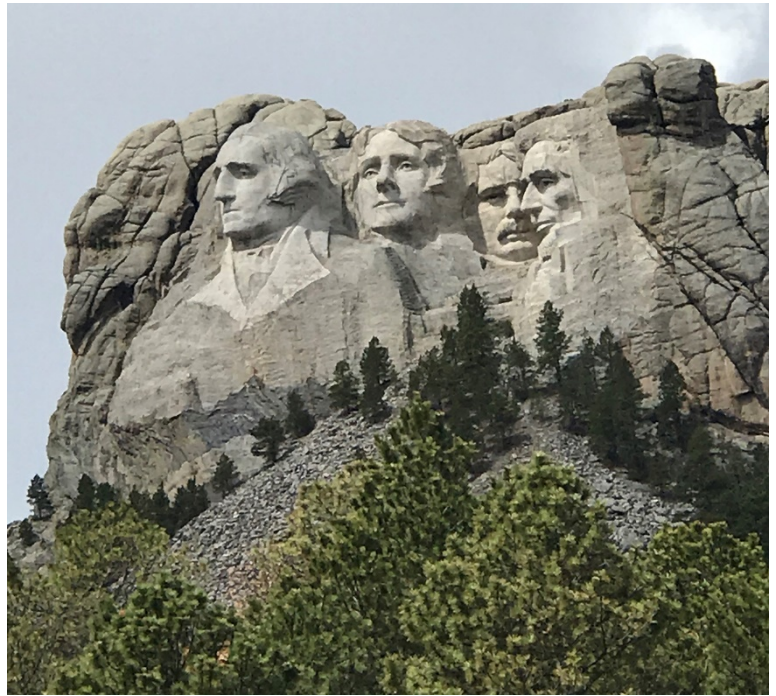
