At their Third Reunion, held at Pella Iowa, July 4-7, 2002, former crewmembers of the USS BRADLEY (DE/FF1041) established a ship's association. The purpose of this association is to plan future reunions and to bring together, for fellowship, all former crewmembers of the Bradley.

The Third Reunion was held in the quaint midwestern town of Pella, Iowa that celebrates it's Dutch heritage in architecture and cultural events. It's also the home to the Pella Window Corporation and a farm equipment company. The Country Inn and Suites served as reunion headquarters and was the site for many reunion events. A catered supper including delicious smoked Iowa pork chops, was followed by an evening of socializing and reminiscing. Some attendees enjoyed the hot tub before retiring for the evening.

An afternoon social was the setting for the establishment of the USS Bradley Association. Various options for future reunions were discussed. Many favored a Caribbean cruise, perhaps during March of 2004. The group decided that a mailing list of former crewmembers would be developed.
